## Greetings Mary's Mantle Supporters!

As signs of Spring are peeking out all around us, I am reminded of the beautiful gift of new life. Here at Mary's Mantle, we are gearing up to greet two new babies this spring. What a wonderful blessing they will be to all those that come to know them. Each of their moms have been busy preparing for their birth, and it is an exciting time for all of our women and staff!

While we joyfully celebrate every new baby that enters our home, we know that the work we do with our women before and after their baby is born is equally important. For this reason, Mary's Mantle is very committed to having a personalized program that each of our women follow. Our hope and prayer is that every woman that departs from Mary's Mantle leaves in a stronger position than when they came. We want our women to leave with lifelong change that will continue to follow them once they are on their own.



First, we want to establish or strengthen each woman's love for Jesus Christ. As believers, we know that lifelong change has to start with Him. Our women come from all walks of faith, and our Spiritual Coordinator meets

with them after they arrive to begin this journey. We start where they are, at their own personal comfort level. All of our women spend time daily in morning and evening prayer, participate in Bible Study, and attend church services on Sundays. We want to create an open and loving environment where they can learn about God's love.

Programming continues as our Case Manager works with each woman to form educational and vocational goals. This may include GED or college classes, job readiness skills, internship opportunities,

résumé writing, job searches and interview preparation. The Case Manager works with the women to help them create budgets and learn money management skills. Our goal is for each woman to leave here with a job and budget in place that will meet her needs, and those of her baby.

Programming also includes classes on various topics such as Nutrition, Parenting Skills, Self-Esteem, Relationship Building, Cooking, Home Maintenance, and Spiritual Growth. Again, our hope is that each woman leaves with skills that they may have never been taught before. We ensure that each woman's emotional and health needs are being met through regular therapy and medical appointments.

We know that the Lord has big plans for each woman that we serve, and we are happy to walk alongside her in her journey. With our generous supporters, committed staff, and board members, we are able to offer each woman so much more than simply a place to sleep. Thank you for your continued prayers for our ministry and the women and babies we serve.

## MARY'S MANTLE AFTER-CARE PROGRAM (MM-AC)

To be pro-life means so much to us at Mary's Mantle. For us, being pro-LIFE means supporting our women and babies far beyond just the birth of the baby. The women we are called to serve are parents; they work, they pray, and they need food and encouragement. The After-Care program supports our women to be the best possible parents to these beautiful souls that God created.

Some people say, "You are where you come from." Yet, each of our women struggles every day to overcome their past, and most of them are succeeding with our support. However, Mary's Mantle does not offer a hand-out; we provide a hand up.

We are there to fill in the gaps of need for the mom in Detroit who takes four buses to get to her job and works a full day, yet still doesn't have enough money to buy diapers at the end of the week. We are a hand up to this family who struggles and works hard, but is still unable to make ends meet.

When another mom across town gets laid off from a full time job and loses her home while she searches for a new job, Mary's Mantle is there to help her find temporary shelter for herself and two children. We are there to support her with food, clothing and necessities, until one of her interviews pan out. We are a hand up to this mother, to help keep her babies safe and to keep her focused on standing on her own feet again.

A mom recently explained that she "was making it" but still felt alone. "Have you ever been with your kids, safe in your own home, but felt alone?" Isolation is a difficult thing to overcome. MM-AC visits these moms and babies to help alleviate this. Many of our alumni are thankful for our free counselors who provide additional mental health support.

Other mothers are now more established with homes, jobs, and transportation of their own. For these mothers, we offer support through helping them focus on growth and family goals. Some of them wish to focus on job skills; in those cases, our home visitors may go through interviewing techniques and dealing with conflict at work, while also pointing them toward classes in the community. Some are working to pay off bills or buy a car; home visitors help them develop a financial plan and saving schedule.

There are no handouts here, but instead an earned hand up - no matter what that looks like for the individual family. At MM-AC, we have learned firsthand that being pro-life not only means supporting the birth of the baby, but that the child's LIFE is precious. We are determined to be the vessels from which the love of Jesus and Mary flows into their lives, assuring that they will have a good beginning.


