## VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT: CHERYL MAZZARA



Dr. Cheryl Mazzara has been a dedicated volunteer with Mary's Mantle since 2013. With an MD specializing in psychiatry and child psychiatry as well as a certificate in spiritual direction, Cheryl has been an invaluable resource. She began her involvement at Mary's Mantle by meeting with the residents for spiritual direction on a weekly basis.

Of this experience, Cheryl says, "I see my spiritual direction sessions as an opportunity to meet with the women as a group to discuss where they are spiritually and how they see God working in their lives. We discuss their personal prayer and ways of praying. I try to help increase their awareness of God's love in

their lives. We pray for each other. We discuss how to deal with specific emotional problems such as anxiety, anger and issues with interpersonal relationships, as well as past traumatic events. I see this as one small piece in the overall picture of what everyone is doing at Mary's Mantle."

Cheryl has also begun to administer psychiatric evaluations for our residents upon admission and after the birth of their children, as well as for After-Care participants as needed. The information gained from these assessments becomes a valuable tool in order for the staff to ensure that the needs of each person we serve are being met. The ministry and our residents are forever indebted to Cheryl for her generosity in sharing her time and knowledge with us.

## MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE MANAGER

Hello! My name is Joanna Willis and I am the House Manager at Mary's Mantle. I have been a part of this wonderful ministry for about a year and a half. I began my professional pro-life journey after I graduated with my bachelors in Psychology from Oakland University in December of 2003. I volunteered as a counselor at Mother and Unborn Baby Care from 2004-2008. While there, I counseled abortion-minded women, prayed with them, gave them resources, and provided them with support as they received free pregnancy tests and ultrasounds at the center. It was a blessing to serve MAUBC in this capacity. I obtained my Masters in Counseling in 2008.

Prior to coming to Mary's Mantle, I worked as a social worker in child welfare for 12 years. The majority of my career has been spent supporting, encouraging and empowering young mothers, which is where my heart lays. I was excited when the opportunity arose to become a part of the Mary's Mantle team. As a woman of faith, I have a heart for women's ministry. I understand that I am only one person and cannot reach the whole world, but I have an open heart and desire for the Lord to use me and help me to reach those in my community. While we may not serve large numbers at Mary's Mantle, the work we do with the

women is long-lasting, and can affect generations to come. By assisting the women with goals such as obtaining their GED or enrolling into college, establishing employment, and assisting them with securing housing, we help the women establish long-term change.

As a woman of faith who has a personal relationship with the Lord, I consider it an honor to be able to talk to the women at Mary's Mantle about the Lord on a daily basis. I enjoy sharing my testimony and reminding the women that the Lord loves them and is with them always. To bring about life-long change, we know that the women must develop a personal relationship with the Lord. The day staff facilitates morning devotions daily with the women and the House Mother has evening prayer with the women every night. The women attend weekly bible studies, monthly spiritual events, meet with a Spiritual Director, and attend church services on Sundays. One of my favorite scriptures is Psalms 147:3: "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds." Our women have been through trauma; they've been abandoned and let down. What a blessing it is to be able to pray for and with them, love on them, and cheer them on. God is love, and every day we strive to show God's love to all the women at Mary's Mantle.
