

One in Need

One Saturday in May 2009, two young girls walked into Faith @ Work, a Catholic bookstore in Troy, Michigan, owned by Beth Collison--a woman known for her good works. These girls weren't just typical shoppers, they were looking for help. One of the girls was there for friendship's sake; the other one, because she was pregnant. This young pregnant girl was thrown out of her house when she told her parents about her pregnancy. With the encouragement and support of her friend, she asked Beth if there was a place for her to stay or if there was someone to help her find a place to live. Filled with compassion, Beth made some phone calls, but it was a Saturday afternoon, thus making it difficult to reach anyone. Beth told the young girl that if she returned on Monday, she would have things arranged and help would be available for her.

But the girl never returned...

A few days later, the young pregnant girl's friend came back to the bookstore. She told Beth that her friend was greatly influenced and persuaded by her boyfriend (the baby's father) to have an abortion. She was convinced that if the baby "was gone,"

her family problems would go away...

That single incident lit a fire in Beth. She thought to herself, "'If we preach against abortion, there needs to be an alternative for these girls.'"

Thus, Mary's Mantle was born.

Mary's Mantle is a 2500 sq. ft. residential home that can hold up to four residents at a time. Several churches in the area became involved in the early days and came together to help make the house a home. Mary's Mantle is a program that helps women plan their lives around the unborn baby they are carrying. The program includes education, financial planning, nutrition awareness, child parenting classes, Bible study, and most of all, love through a Christian atmosphere. Mary's Mantle staffs an Executive Director, a licensed case worker, two 24 hour live-in housemothers (a religious sister and a faith-filled lay woman), and support staff--all run by a Board of Directors that are dedicated to raising funds to support the ongoing mission of Mary's Mantle.

Mary's Mantle is a Catholic home designed for expectant women who have no place to go. Our Catholic faith calls us to love God with all our heart, soul and mind, and to love our neighbor as ourselves. Because the tragedy of abortion remains legal in the United States, we are compelled to make a special effort to love these pregnant women as ourselves and assist them in their transition into motherhood in a spiritual, and nurturing, caring environment.
