Mary's Mantle After Care Program

ur After Care (AC) program was born out of the acknowledged need of our women after they leave the safe haven of the Mary's Mantle Residential Program. Given the ordinary challenges of society and with only old, sometimes unhealthy relationships to depend on, our women found it very difficult to practice the new positive skills that they had learned in the Residential Program. AC is a way for us to support them as they continue their journey into independent, self-sustaining lives. While the focus of the Residential Program is to assist them in the transition into motherhood, it is the focus of AC to assist them in maintaining their self-sufficiency and enable them to help their child(ren) to develop appropriately until the child is ready to enter Kindergarten. We are committed to the healthy development of each child by ensuring the continued support of the mother through education and empowerment to raise her child in a dignified manner.

One of the ways we do this is through our play groups. Part of our time together is spent in reviewing short DVD videos involving Love and Logic strategies, then we discuss current frustrations, and facilitate discussion on handling their children in stressful situations. After these sessions we spend more time with the toddlers all together and try practicing some of the new strategies before going home and continuing with new parenting skills. A secondary, but equally powerful piece of these play groups, is networking. These mothers are often still isolated from positive influences and socializing with and coming to trust and rely on each other (other moms who have been through what they have and have the same struggles) is a great comfort. We help them form bonds with each other so that they have a support group within themselves.
